My Belize Experience by Braelyn Spencer

This spring, I had the incredible opportunity to travel to **Belize** on an **Immersion Service Learning** trip. It was an experience I will never forget. While the trip was centered on the preservation of natural resources and learning about the experiences of the Mayan people, upon reflection, I realize that it was so much more than just that. It was a trip that taught me invaluable lessons about happiness, compassion, and connection.

The journey began at the **Belize Zoo** and the beautiful **Tropical Education Center**. At this rescue and rehabilitation facility, my group and I helped paint fences and animal shelters in preparation for the arrival of baby Grace, a young tapir. It was incredibly rewarding to see the tangible impact of our efforts. However, it was the time we spent with the dedicated staff, of whom quickly became our friends, that was even more meaningful.







Next, we ventured to **Maya Center**—a small village full of life, warmth, and endless opportunities to learn. Upon our arrival, we were warmly welcomed by Gregorio at **Tutzil Nah Cottages and Tours**. During our stay, we spent our days at the local school, building new doors for the classrooms, and immersing ourselves in Mayan culture. Gregorio and his family embraced us as their own, and our evenings were filled with memorable conversations. As the sun rose each morning, we eagerly began another adventure-filled day in beautiful Belize.

Since returning home, my group mates and I have been meeting virtually with Gregorio as he shares stories of his life in the jungle. We are working together to compile these stories into a book—a keepsake for his family to treasure for generations.

I am deeply grateful to have received a bursary generously provided by an ISL donor endowment, which made this journey possible. I had always dreamed of taking part in an experience like this, and it has truly ignited my passion for
